



Shiraz Mujtaba is a Professor of Biology at the City University of New York. Dr. Mujtaba got his Ph.D. in 1999 from the Post-Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Chandigarh, India. His PhD thesis focused on in the molecular- and immuno -pathogenesis of HIV/AIDS. Before that, he got Master's in Science from the University of Roorkee, currently Indian Institute of Technology, Roorkee. Dr. Mujtaba's research interests concentrate on understanding the molecular basis of gene regulation directed by epigenetic mechanisms.
